1955, Women of Achievement is the **oldest, ongoing program in the area whose sole mission is to honor and recognize the volunteer service and volunteer leadership of women**. Each year, Women of Achievement selects 10 honorees from an extensive process beginning with nominations submitted by the public. The honorees are volunteers who have demonstrated outstanding commitment to the betterment of the St. Louis region through uncompensated voluntary contributions, volunteer leadership and a significant breadth of a volunteer career.

The Class of 2025 honorees will be recognized at the 2025 Women of Achievement Award Luncheon on Tuesday, May 13 at the Ritz-Carlton, St. Louis. Doors open at 11:15 a.m. The luncheon ends at 1:30 p.m. This year's luncheon chair is Julie Williams (Class of 2022) and the vice chair is Vicki Friedman (Class of 2022).
